Vs. 20

Vs. 23 Well-wishers of Duryodhan Assembled here I shall scan "They are backing this unrighteous war Let me behold them from my car"

By Arjuna thus addressed
Sri Krishna placed the chariot
In between the two armies
That stood there face to face

Vs. 25
In front of Bhishma and Drona
Lord Krishna spoke to Arjuna
"Behold the Kauravas assembled here
To fight with you in this warfare"

Arjuna beheld both armies
kith and kin, uncles and teachers
Brothers, cousins, granduncles
Sons, friends and maternal uncles

Vs. 27

Fathers-in-law and well-wishers Many of his close relatives All who have joined for this terrible war Arjuna saw them from his car

Vs. 28

Possessed by extreme compassion Arjuna uttered these words in passion; Krishna seeing these kinsmen Attcked am I by fear of sin (karma)

Vs. 29

Krishna, my limbs are scorched Keshava, my mouth is parched See how my whole frame does See how my hairs stand on end

Vs. 30

Drops from my hand the Gandiva Bow My skin is burning - I know not how -My head is reeling and so is my mind I am even unable to stand

Vs. 31

Inauspicious omens I see Keshava, what good can it be? To kill in battle kith and kin Can only bring a terrible sin (karma)

Vs 32

Krishna, victory I covet not Kingdom or pleasure I seek not What good is a kingdom or luxuries Or even this life unto us?

Vs. 33

Those for whose sake we desire the throne Luxuries, pleasures and the crown Those teachers, uncles and sons Are here arrayed, staking their lives

Vs. 34

Grandsons, sons and granduncles Maternal uncles and uncles Preceptors, fathers-in law Other relations and brothers-in law For earthly possessions I slay them not Let them kill me---I am ready for that---Sovereignty of the three spheres Is nothing to me and gives no cheer

Vs. 36

How can we have any happiness From slaying Dritarastra's sons? By destroying these aggressors Sin (karma) will surely accrue to us

Vs. 37

Therefore, It would not be right For us --- we should know how to act After killing our own kinsmen How can we be happy then?

Vs. 38

With minds blinded by greed, these men See not destruction of race as sin (karma) Sin accruing from rimes Destroys friend and men of amity

Vs. 39

The wrong in destruction of family Krishna, we can see clearly Why should we not turn from crime Which will bring us sin and shame?

Vs. 40

Ageless family tradition
Will be lost by this destruction
Virtue having once been lost
Sin overtakes the entire lot

Vs. 41

Vice enters the hearts of women Through the death of their own men Corruption causes intermixture Of blood that leads to disaster

Vs. 42

Corruption leads only to hell And destroys the race as well Deprived of all oblations Forefather fall from heavens

Vs. 43

The race is brought to utter disaster By the evil of intermixture Cast, tradition and customs cease Righteousness is effaced

Vs. 44

Men who have lost traditions dwell For an indefinite period in hell Krishna, this is what I have heard So thus incurred sits on the head

Vs. 45

Alas! Though possessed of intelligence We desist not from indulgence In the great sin of greed for throne And kill our own kinsmen

Vs. 46.

If the sons of Dhritarastra kill
Me unarmed in this battle
If, armed with weapons, they should come
I would say that death is welcome

Agitated by grief, thus and laying down his bow and arrows Arjuna sank into the seat Of his mighty chariot
